### LUNATICS WIN THE 1994 STATE CHAMPIONSHIP

On Sunday, May 8th, our boys Under 11 Premier team, the Lunatics, were crowned State Champions when they defeated the Hulmeville Rowdies by the lopsided score of 6-0. Hulmeville, from Bucks County, was the three time Inter-County League Champion and were considered by some to be the favorites to win the Cups.

The State Cups started in early March when 36 teams were placed into four team brackets. The Lunatics drew Back Mountain from Scranton, Kensington Coppa from Philadelphia and the Hershey Hurricanes.

Back Mountain proved to be no contest as the locals offense exploded for a 7-0 win. Erik Blindenbacher notched two goals while goalie David Hanlon earned the shutout.

The second game was against Kensington who had defeated the Lunatics 3-2 in the Indoor State Cup championship game. The Lunatics scored first as Bernard Horshaw beat three defenders and the goalie on a great solo effort. In the second half, Kensington tied it up at 1-1 and that's how the game ended.

The Lunatics needed a four goal win against Hershey to advance to the quarterfinals. Striker Richard "Fuzzy" Zeller took matters into his own hands, as he recorded a four goal game. His teammates put in four others while Hanlon got another shutout to win the game 8-0 and go to the quarterfinals.

With only eight of the 36 teams left in the Cups, the team traveled up to Allentown to meet Tri-Boro. Zeller needed only 36 seconds to give the locals a lead that they would never lose. Three minutes later, Tony Frick put in a magnificent head ball to make it 2-0. Center fullback Drew Delaney put in the first of his three goals on the day to give the Lunatics a 3-0 halftime lead.

In the second half, Horshaw scored, as did defenders Andrew Brass and Noah Chesbrough who had both moved up to offense. Goalie Hanlon moved up to left wing to score the final goal of the 9-0 massacre. The win put the Lunatics into the semifinals against the very tough Yardley-Morrisville Comets.

Ten minutes into the semifinal, left winger Ryan Gutzler beat two defenders, dribbled around the Comets goalie and scored to give the Lunatics a 1-0 lead. The Comets defense managed to keep the high powered LMSC offense under control. Yardley's hard work paid off as the Comets tied the game in the second half.

The game appeared to be going into overtime when Matt Skipper made a beautiful run down the middle of the field and buried a left footed blast with only three minutes remaining to give Lower Merion a 2-1 win and a trip to the State Final game.

In the State Championship game, the LMSC defense completely shutdown the Hulmeville attack. Marking back Dan Geraghty kept Hulmeville's star left winger from doing anything creative with the ball. Ben Garber was assigned to mark the Rowdies speedy right winger. These two, along with center back Drew Delaney, sweeper back Frick and goalie Hanlon kept the Rowdies from ever getting on the scoreboard.

Early in the game, Horshaw again proved why he is one of the very best players in the state as he took a nice through ball from Frick to make it 1-0. Horshaw quickly scored a second goal on a great run down the wing. Zeller added another goal, taking on three defenders in the penalty area to give the Lunatics a well earned 3-0 halftime lead.

Midfielders Matt Skipper, Adam Chesbrough and Erik Blindenbacher were back on every Hulmeville play to win the ball and then up on the offense to support the attack. Their speed and hustle and endurance kept Hulmeville from controlling the ball very much during the game.

In the second half, Andrew Brass, Ted Domers and Noah Chesbrough all added insurance goals for Lower Merion. Hanlon and his defense earned their fourth shutout in six games and the Lunatics were crowned State Champions for 1994.

During the entire tournament, the Lunatics outscored the opposition 33-2 and never trailed at any time. The team now has their sights on winning next year's State Championship at Under 12 where the winners from 15 States (Maine through West Virginia) will advance to compete in the Region 1 USA Championships.

## **FIREBIRDS TAKE SECOND IN STATE CUPS**

Our U-11 girls team, the Firebirds, took second place in the State Cups, the best finish ever for a girls LMSC team. The team lost the State Championship game to Council Rock 2-1 in double overtime.

After a scoreless first half, Council Rock scored with 13 minutes left in regulation to take a 1-0 lead. LMSC tied it up five minutes later when Claire Laver boomed a 25 yard direct free kick to the near post and into the net. The teams battled on to the conclusion of regulation and through the first 10 minute overtime period without another score. Finally, with two minutes left in the second overtime, Council Rock scored and time expired before the Firebirds could once more equalize.

Many Firebirds excelled in this classic soccer game. Goalie Livia Barton made 16 saves to keep the Firebirds in the match. She had no chance on the two goals and played a near flawless game. Similarly, the defense, led by sweeper Johanna Gelber, marking backs Rebecca Kornberg, Katy Heuisler, Emily Moore, Lauren Herman and Erin Venafr along with defensive midfielder Laver consistently tackled, cleared the ball and started offensive runs.

Midfielders Angel Schleinkofer, Rachel Prowler, Colleen Narvaez and Liz Leonard also worked well at getting the ball on defense and moving it up to the attack. Forwards Elizabeth Pillion, Ruth Kelley, Katie Block and Jamie Sundheim put constant pressure on the Outlaw defenders and created numerous scoring opportunities on great passing combinations and individual runs.

Six players - Gelber, Moore, Kornberg, Laver, Pillion and Barton deserve special credit for playing all 80 minutes of the championship game.

The Firebirds got to the final in the 12 team tournament by winning preliminary round games 2-1 against Montgomery and 5-1 against Warminster. In the semi finals, the Firebirds beat Hulmeville 1-0.

The Firebirds, under coach Lance Laver, finished second to Council Rock in both the Indoor State Cups and the Outdoor State Cups.

Many of our Premier Division teams played in various tournaments this spring. In the Bethlehem tournament, our girls U-10 team, the Hawks, led by new coach Tony Greaves, had their best soccer outing, going 3-1 to take 2nd place in the tournament. In their first game against Wyomissing, the Hawks' Linette Babiarz first timed a cross from Heather Berlin for a 1-0 win. Goalie Joanna Lane was flawless in recording the shutout.

In their second game, the Hawks crushed Bethlehem 6-0 led by four goals from Babiarz and one goal each from Lindsey Blumenthal and Suzanne Bernstock. Elissa Rosen recorded this shutout, despite playing with a broken finger. The Hawks third game was against West Chester. Despite goals from Blumenthal and Babiarz, the team went down 5-2.

The Hawks quickly got back on track in their fourth game as they defeated South Parkland 3-1 as Babiarz got two more goals and Rachel Ross also scored. The defense was excellent all tournament thanks to the work of Berlin, Kristen Kessock, Lindsay Tintentfass and Emily Davis.

Congratulations to the Hawks on their performances this winter and spring. The team seems to have finally turned the corner to success under new coach Tony Greaves. Best of luck to the Hawks, we wish all of you continued success.

Our U-11 girls, the Firebirds won the Bethlehem tournament thanks to a 2-0 win over Tri-County U-11 League champion Downingtown. The Firebirds played "up" at the U-12 division last fall so they did not see them in league play. The Firebirds once again got strong defense from Johanna Gelber, Emily Moore and goalie Livia Barton.

The U-11 boys Lunatics took first place up in Long Island at the Massapequa tournament, going 4-0-1. The team was led on offense by Adam Chesbrough who had five goals on the weekend, defender Drew Delaney and goalie David Hanlon who gave up only three goals all tournament. The highlight of the tournament came against Valley Stream (N.Y.) as the Lunatics' were losing 1-0. With one minute left in the game, Ryan Gutzler scored to tie it. Right after that, Gutzler passed to Chesbrough who beat two defenders and scored the game winner with 20 seconds left.

The Lunatics also defeated New York State Cup semifinalist West Babylon 3-1 and tied the Rhode Island State Champions 0-0 to clinch the tournament.

The following week, the Lunatics went 5-0 to win the Perkiomen Valley Tournament. They were led by an 11 goal effort from Gutzler a 9 goal effort from Matt Skipper and standout goaltending from Bernard Horshaw and Andrew Brass. Gutzler was voted the MVP of the tournament and won an Adidas equipment bag for his excellent play.

## **EXPANSION OF OUR FALL INTRAMURAL PROGRAM**

Please remember that we have expanded the 1994 Fall Intramural Program to include 12 year old boys and girls (those born in 1982). We have divided the oldest boys division into the Seniors (born in 1984 and 1985) and the Majors Division (born in 1982 and 1983). Similarly, we have divided the oldest girls division into the Electrons (born in 1984 and 1985) and the Cosmos Division (born in 1982 and 1983).

The boys divisions will play 11 vs. 11, tentatively set for McMoran Playground. The girls divisions will play 7 vs. 7, tentatively set for Merion Elementary School.

All four of these divisions will keep league standings and have champion playoff games held at the end of the season.

Please remember that we only guarantee acceptance into the program for registrations received by August 20th. Late registrations will only be accepted if there is room in the program. ## **DELCO LEAGUE HALL OF FAME**

Each year the Delco Soccer League inducts a few special people into their hall of fame to recognize some of the great contributions made to the league over the years. This spring, the third class of inductees went into the Hall Of Fame. Two of this years class are long time associates of LMSC.

The first, Ed Hochreiter, was director of the Gladwyne Soccer Club for over 10 years. Ed coached several very strong teams at Gladwyne and many of his players went on to star at the college level. Ed was also a Delco League Select coach, and an officer in both the Delco League and in EPYSA, our state association.

The other LMSC inductee was our current president, Bruno Ceccarelli. Chick was the director of the Wynnewood Soccer program for many years. One of his teams won a State Championship and earned numerous other honors. One of his players, his son Justin, is now playing for the Philadelphia Freedom.

Ed and Chick were both very instrumental in Gladwyne, Penn Valley, Wynnewood and Narberth soccer clubs merging into Lower Merion Soccer Club back in 1989. This resulted in a club that was large enough to offer a variety of levels of soccer so that all players could have a place to play. Congratulations to both Ed and Chick for all their years of work in youth soccer.

## **U.S.S.F. COACHING COURSE GRADUATES**

Each year we allocate a significant size of our budget to making our coaches (intramural and travel) better prepared to coach. Depending on the program, we distribute various coaching manuals and coaching videos so that our coaches will be able to accomplish more with their team.
