UNDER 16 BOYS WIN INDOOR STATE CHAMPIONSHIP

On March 24th, our boys Under 16 Premier team, known as F.C. Joe, were crowned Indoor State Champions, defeating York United 2-1 in sudden death overtime in the championship game. The tournament was competed for by the top 16 teams in the state.

Lower Merion opened up with a 2-1 win over Bethlehem as Tim Bradley netted two goals. The second game would prove to be the toughest for the team as they went up against a very powerful Council Rock team. Bradley put Lower Merion ahead but Rock came back to tie it at 1-1. Goaltender Matt Schuh, subbing for an injured Mike Dubin, made many fines saves and kept Rock off the scoreboard the rest of the way. Matt was helped at defense by Rich Kinderman, Kevin Keating, Mike Tiedeman, Craig Cowperthwait and Andy Gold, all members of the Haverford School varsity. Both Sean McLaughlin and Cowperthwait were steadfast defenders in front of Schuh.

LM needed a win in the third and final preliminary game to advance to the semifinals. Tredyffrin-Easttown put up a good fight but went down 2-1. Bradley and Tiedeman each scored to put LM into the semifinals.

In the semifinals, York United beat Nether Providence 2-0 while Lower Merion defeated Hulmeville 3-2. Mike Tiedeman scored one goal and Justin Hopkins scored two, the second with just seconds left in the game.

The final game proved to be a classic as Bradley opened up the scoring for LMSC. York tied up the game at 1 and pressed for an equalizer but could not get the ball past goaltender Schuh. Regulation ended with the score tied at 1-1 which meant the two teams would play overtime with neither team able to use a goalie.

The Lower Merion defense marked up the York attackers tightly since they knew any shot on goal could end the game. Three minutes into overtime, Justin Hopkins headed a crossed ball between a York defender and the goal post to give Lower Merion the victory and the State Championship trophy which was presented to head coach and LMSC Vice President Joe Hopkins. This is the third State Championship trophy that Joe has won as coach since moving to Lower Merion 7 years ago.

In outdoor State Cup action, our U-12 girls team, the Firebirds, lost in the semifinals 3-2 to Warminster. Had the Firebirds won, they would have advanced to the State Cup Final against Council Rock who defeated the Firebirds last year in the State Championship game in overtime. Both finalists advanced to the USA Regional Championship, competed for by State Cup Champions from Maine through West Virginia since our state was given two births in the tournament at that age group.

Our U-12 boys team, the Lunatics, lost in the fourth round of their outdoor cups to Hulmeville 1-0. Last year, the Lunatics defeated Hulmeville 6-0 in the State Cup Final. This year, the offense was unable to finish so they were not able to repeat as State Cup champions.

U-16 AND U-19 BOYS TEAMS WIN DELCO WINTER LEAGUE

Our two boys winter league teams, the U-19 Gorillas and the U-16 F.C. Joe both were crowned champions on March 26th. The Gorillas, all local area high school seniors, defeated West Chester 2-0 on goals by Adrian Cox (U. Richmond) and Eric Hopkins (Lafayette College) with Jon Hanks (Lafayette) assisting on both goals. Goalie Jon Conway (Rutgers) and sweeper Josh Pincus (Cornell) anchored an airtight defense.

Immediately after the Gorillas win, the U-16s took to the field and defeated Havertown 6-0 with 6 players scoring. This came only three days after they won the indoor state championship, capping a great win for the U-16s.

LUNATICS CONQUER THE SPECTRUM

Our Under 12 Boys Premier team, the Lunatics took first place in a 16 team indoor tournament at the Spectrum, defeating Hamilton, New Jersey in the finals. Richard "Fuzzy" Zeller led the way with nine goals during the tournament. Ryan Gutzler scored two goals in the championship game while Matt Skipper had more assists than anyone could count.

That evening, the players were honored at halftime of the Philadelphia Wings lacrosse game where 17,000 enthusiastic lacrosse fans cheered them on. The players also got to meet the world famous Bud Lite Girls before going out for the awards ceremony. Unfortunately they were unable to get any phone numbers but they do claim to have won the hearts of all three ladies.

STATE CUP HONOR ROLL

Each year our travel teams Under 11 and up are eligible to compete in both the Indoor and Outdoor State Cups. In 1995, our U-16 boys team, F.C. Joe, won the U-16 Indoor State Championship, giving LMSC its sixth State Championship since 1989.

In 1990, the U-13 Gorillas won the Indoor and Outdoor State Cups in the same season. They are one of only seven teams in the state to ever accomplish that feat.

U.S.S.F. COACHING COURSE GRADUATES

Each year we allocate a significant size of our budget to making our coaches (intramural and travel) better prepared to coach. Depending on the program, we distribute various coaching manuals and coaching videos so that our coaches will be able to accomplish more with their team.

Each year, we pay the full cost to any coach who takes one of the six different coaching courses sponsored by the United States Soccer Federation. Many of our intramural coaches have completed the nine hour 'F' level course. Almost all of our head coaches in the Travel Team Program have completed the 18 hour 'E' level course, many coaches in the older age groups have completed the 36 hour 'D' course.

U.S.S.F. REFEREE COURSE GRADUATES

This spring, for the first time, LMSC offered a six night course leading to certification to referee travel team games. The course was very intense, taught by several of Southeast Pennsylvania's top referees. A final exam was held at the end of the sixth night.

Many of the people taking the course are current LMSC travel team players, playing Under 14 or older. You must be at least 14 years of age to take the course. The following people passed the referee course and earned their referee license:

In early September, LMSC is planning to offer a single night introduction to the laws of soccer for coaches and parents. This is a three hour introductory course run by EPSARC, our local referee association. The seminar will be limited to 30 people. SOCCER EQUIPMENT AND UNIFORMS

As mentioned in our spring newsletter, Sneaky Pete's of Ardmore carries a full line of our intramural and travel team game shorts and game socks. Travel team players requiring a jersey after our initial orders were taken at Travel Team Registration on May 31st may purchase a jersey at Sneaky Pete's. Be sure that your coach assigns a jersey number for you.

Sneaky Pete's also carries all of our various catalog items, including LMSC sweat suits, polo shirts, jackets, equipment bags, soccer balls and our LMSC hat (made by Game).

They also carry a full line of soccer shoes for both indoor and outdoor, as well as shin guards. Sneaky Pete's is located on 49 West Lancaster Avenue in Ardmore, about three doors down from Boston Chicken. Sneaky Pete's phone number is 642-4470.

FALL REFEREE AND FIELD CREW APPLICATIONS

Enclosed in this newsletter is an application form for the positions of referee and field crew for the 1995 Fall Intramural Program. Below is a description of each of the positions. If you are interested in working this fall in any of the positions, please fill out and mail back the application form to our Gladwyne address. Applications should be received no later than August 10th. The intramural season will begin on Saturday, September 9th and run through the middle of November. Games are played each Saturday during that time period.

Referees will NOT have to be available each Saturday. They will only be asked to work on days that their personal schedule permits them. We are especially looking for girls who play in the Travel Team Program since most of their games are on Sundays.

SENIOR SOCCER REFEREES - Senior referees must be at least 14 years of age. Travel team players 12 and older may also apply. Experience in the LMSC Travel Team Program or a high school program is preferred. Senior referees will do games which are played in the older divisions and last one hour. Referees will be paid \$10 per game. Games start on the hour starting at 9:00 AM and go until 5:00 PM each Saturday. Senior referees do divisions for players ages 7, 8, 9-10 or 11-13. Games will be at Merion Elementary School, Gladwyne Elementary School, McMoran Playground and Bala Park. There will be one referee per game.

JUNIOR SOCCER REFEREES - Junior referees must be 13 years of age. Travel team players 11 and older may also apply. Experience in the LMSC Travel Team Program or a high school program is preferred. Referees will be paid \$8.00 for each session which will run approximately 75 minutes each, the players will be 5-6 years of age. Girls games will be at South Ardmore Park in Wynnewood, boys games will be at Gladwyne Playground. Both fields have sessions starting at 9:00, 10:15, 11:30 and 12:45. Referees will also be expected to help the coaches teach the basic skills and tactics of the game to the players as well as help with the skills clinic held at the start of each session.

Referees will be expected to dress in soccer attire and must provide their own whistle. The referee assignor will call all referees each Thursday to find out which referees are available for that weekend. The referee assignor this fall will be Paul Geraghty, Jr. Rules and regulations will be forwarded to the referees.

FIELD CREW - Field crew members are paid \$10 an hour to set up nets, line fields, remove trash and take down nets. The field crew members must be at least 13 years of age. They will need to have nets set up on Friday night or Saturday morning by 9:00 AM at both

Gladwyne Elementary School and Bala Park and have the nets taken down on Sunday evening.

Field lining can be done Thursday or Friday evening or before 9:00 AM on Saturday. LMSC provides all the necessary equipment and stores it near the fields.

If you are interested in any of these positions, please fill out and return the enclosed application form no later than August 10th.

JOB OPENINGS AT LMSC

With our program expanding each year (we now have over 2000 youngsters playing), we are looking to hire one or more paid administrative assistants.

Qualified adults must live near Wynnewood, have access to a car, NOT have a full time job, be computer literate and be available to perform such jobs as taking soccer manuals and letter to be photocopied, stuffing envelopes and mailing them, entering information into our computerized data base system, sorting fall intramural registrations as they arrive in the mail and answering messages left on our LMSC hotline.

Candidate(s) must be available during mid-August and early September as this is our busiest time of the year. If you are interested in interviewing for this position, please type up a brief resume stating your qualifications, availability and current involvement in LMSC (parent of player, etc.) Mail this in to LMSC, Box 469, Gladwyne, PA 19035. Resumes should be received by July 10th. We will set up interviews in mid July.

EXPANSION OF OUR FALL INTRAMURAL PROGRAM

As mentioned in the spring newsletter, our 1995 Fall Intramural Program will expand to include 13 year old boys and girls (those born in 1982). Our two oldest divisions, the boys Majors and the girls Cosmos Division will be for players born in 1982, 83 and 84.

Please remember that we only guarantee acceptance into the program for registrations received by August 20th. Late registrations will only be accepted if there is room in the program. Last year we had to turn away over 50 players due to late registration. PLEASE do yourself a favor and register early.

Again, our thanks to Township Commissioners Brian Rosenthal and Alan Kessler for their hard work in obtaining additional fields which have allowed us to expand our intramural program.

PICKUP SOCCER FOR ADULTS MALE AND FEMALE

This past spring, many of our coaches organized an informal pickup soccer program which was played once a week. The program was a large success as we had games of 6 v 6 up to 10 v 10 each time. Many of the coaches had little playing experience and learned a lot about soccer from the players' perspective. We hope to organize this again in the fall. We will be sending out information about this to all coaches (travel team and intramural) in the fall.

We have also had a request from several adult females to start pickup soccer games for women. The games would be for women interested in playing but who have little or no prior playing experience. This program would be open to women who coach at LMSC or who have a child playing in LMSC.

As most people know, LMSC sponsors an adult women's team that competes in the Tri-County league. Their home games are at Bryn Mawr Polo Field on Sundays in the fall.

If you are interested in getting more information about playing pickup women's soccer in the fall, please leave your name, address and phone number on our LMSC hotline (215-953-8060) before August. There is no cost to play in this program.
